

## **HubIT First International Workshop Fact Sheet “Ensuring new technologies embrace societal issues and concerns”**

35 people participated from countries including: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Estonia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Turkey, UK.

There were 3 Keynote speakers throughout the day:

- Tomas Matraia - “For a digital social contract: Designing tech-societies with responsibility”
- Yane Frenski - “Innovation and sustainable development - Shaping the people who are shaping our future”
- Anne Haselbacher - “TRUst-Enhancing certified Solutions for SEcurity and protection of Citizens’ rights in digital Europe (TRUESEC) Project.

There were 4 World Café Key Challenges Topics:



- How can we overcome the ICT researchers’ resistance to change?
- How can we educate the Organisation and thus the researchers?
- How can it be ensured that there is quality training for the researchers on things to look out for... Topics etc. (negative uses of research – examples)?
- Maintaining the SSH / ICT infrastructure.

Four groups of people were organised for the World café on key Challenges, with a balance in each group between ICT and SSH participants each group built on the input from the discussions which took place at tables before their turn rather than having to start from scratch.

An “Identification of Best practices for integrating RRI with ICT R&D” session also took place.

Participants were asked to discuss and give input regarding Best Practices related to the following areas:

- Privacy and Data Protection, (Data Protection Officers);
- Health Care, Assisted Living;
- Robotics and AI;
- Cybersecurity.
